A Believer's Testimony

I have been struggling all of my life, and in 2002 I came to Alabama from Mississippi and Louisiana. I lived in Ozark until 2013, and I had left and went back to Louisiana. And in 2014 I came back to Ozark. Then I had moved to New Brockton and the relationship I was in was really bad. And he kept me on crack cocaine for years until one night I just started praying to God to get me out of that situation, and He did.

I left the next day and came to Enterprise on February 8, 2019. And that's when I had quit crack cocaine and got into another abusive relationship until I made him leave in August 2020. And a month later I had met my boyfriend, and we started talking and all of a sudden, he started abusing me and was on Meth. And the abuse lasted for over a year until on December 28, 2022 he went to jail, and I had quit meth, and I have been clean from crack cocaine for three years. And I have been clean from meth for two months.

But I had went through a depression mode for a month and a half to where I was feeling sorry for myself. I was blaming myself, and I didn't want to do anything at all. So, one Friday night I had started talking to God to help me through this situation that I'm going through. And the next morning I heard a voice saying to me, "Go back to Church." So that Sunday morning on February 13, 2022, I came to Johns Chapel AME Church. And when I walked through the door, I felt something. And when I heard the sermon, I knew right then that God was telling me that He got this and that everything was going to be alright and that had motivated me to go up to the front and repent of all my sins. And I asked God to forgive me. So, I joined the church, and it has motivated me even more to get up and get my life back on track. And I thank God every morning for waking me up and for watching over me. And I thank God for all of the blessings that I have been receiving I am truly thankful and blessed.
